

How to Register a Business in DC with a Virtual Office Address

What the DC Government Requires When You Register a Business

Before you can open your doors — virtual or physical — you need to register with the District. Here's what DC regulators require:

- **A DC street address:** The DC Department of Licensing and Consumer Protection (DLCP) requires a physical DC street address for business registration. P.O. boxes are not accepted for most entity types.
- **Articles of Organization or Incorporation:** Depending on your business structure (LLC, corporation, etc.), you'll file with the DC DLCP. Filing fees start at \$99 for most entities.
- **Basic Business License (BBL):** Most businesses operating in DC need a BBL. The address on this license must be a verifiable DC commercial address.
- **Registered Agent:** Your business needs a registered agent with a DC address to receive legal documents and official correspondence on your behalf.

The consistent thread: you need a *real, verifiable DC address*. That's where a virtual office comes in.

Can a Virtual Office Address Work for DC Business Registration?

Step 1: Secure your virtual office agreement

Step 3: File with the DC DLCP

Visit the DC CorpOnline portal at dcra.dc.gov to file your Articles of Organization or Articles of Incorporation. Enter your virtual office address as your principal place of business in DC. Keep your confirmation number — you'll reference it in subsequent steps.

Step 4: Apply for a Basic Business License

Most DC businesses need a BBL, and the type you need depends on your industry. Apply through the DLCP portal using the same address you used for entity formation. Some industries require additional endorsements, inspections, or certifications before the BBL is issued.

Step 5: Register for DC taxes

Register with the DC Office of Tax and Revenue (OTR) for applicable business taxes — including the DC franchise tax for most business entities. Your business address is used here as well. Out-of-state businesses with a DC presence typically need to register as foreign entities before applying for a BBL.

Step 6: Set up reliable mail handling

Your virtual office provider will receive mail on your behalf. Make sure you have a plan for staying on top of incoming regulatory notices, tax documents, and legal correspondence. The best providers offer mail scanning, digital delivery, and forwarding services so nothing slips through the cracks.
